Cooking To Enhance Cross-Cultural Understanding

The Corvallis Multicultural Literacy Center (CMLC) announces a new cookbook project. We invite all residents of the Corvallis area who come from another country to share their personal story, one of their country's recipes with a picture if possible. We will publish your story and recipes in a book.

Send us a favorite recipe from your region and a picture of the dish. (*Take your own picture; do not download from the internet because we plan to publish this book.*) Tell us if it is a traditional dish, and what spices and ingredients you need. If you do not know how to cook your favorite dish, ask your parents or grandparents for help.

Also, send us your little "bio" (story). Your "bio" can include answers to some of these questions: Where are you from? What brought you to Corvallis? How difficult was it to interact with the local people? How did you cope with your everyday life at the beginning? Did you come with your family? What do they do? What are you doing here? What does your day look like? *You don't have to answer all these questions as long as you tell us a little about yourself and your life in Corvallis.* Your "bio" should be 200 words or less.

Send us a picture of you alone or with your family. If you do not feel comfortable sharing a picture of yourself, send a picture, which somehow characterizes YOU-your identity. For example, your favorite dress or pictures of the city you come from.

The CMLC is a community-based learning center where individuals and families of all cultures come together to share, mentor, and understand each other; to access resources; and to build a cohesive community in a safe, welcoming environment. With this book project we would like to present a snapshot of the daily lives of people from other countries who live in Corvallis, in order to share their cultural and ethnic background, and their hopes and desires. Furthermore, we aim to promote peaceful coexistence between people of different origins, colors and religious creeds as well as show how these people add cultural enrichment to the entire city.
